MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ...



I try to not repeat myself in these columns. However, there are a few topics that I cover almost every year. One of these topics is acolumn about coming to Mass in the winter. So why write a similar column again and again?

Because it is important to remind people that although we do have an obligation to come to Mass on Sundays, we also have an obligation to our own health and well-being and the health and wellbeing of our fellow parish members.

First things first if you are truly sick you are not obligated to come to Sunday Mass. Under ordinary circumstances we are required to come to Mass on Sundays under pain of mortal sin, but there are legitimate reasons to miss Mass on Sunday and first among these is illness. Beyond not being obliged to come to Mass if you are sick, as your pastor, for the sake of all the others who will be present, I ask you not to come to church. With all care for your soul, if you are truly sick, you can endanger the health and in some cases the lives of other members of the community, and that is not a particularly Christian thing to do. What might be something you can just shrug off might become something life threatening to a person with a compromised immune system or lung problems.

Second if you are sick and you do come to Mass, please take precautions to not pass your illness on to others. Do not hold hands at the Our Father. Do not shake hands at the sign of peace. Do not receive communion from the chalice. Although no outbreak of illness has ever been traced back to Mass, why take unnecessary risks. The other side of this coin is do not be offended if someone refuses to hold hands during the Our Father or will not shake your hand at the sign of peace. Since generally speaking I cannot miss Mass unless I am trulu on death's doorstep, I will take similar precautions. If I am sick, I will make sure to sanitize my hands just before beginning the Eucharistic Prayer, and again before giving out communion. I also will not greet people before or after Mass. I will do what I can to not share my germs with all of you and I ask you to do the same with each other.

Lastly, I want to write just a bit about winter weather. The meteorologists are expecting a winter here, with extreme cold and more of the white stuff than usual. I want to make a point to mention it. First, no matter how bad the weather is, we will have Sunday Mass, but just as if you are sick you are excused from the obligation to attend Mass, so too if you cannot safely get to Mass you are excused. If you are able to get to Mass then you should come, but if getting here endangers you or your family then please do not come.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

IN THIS TEACHING, JESUS WARNS HIS DISCIPLES TO REMAIN ALERT AND SPIRITUALLY PREPARED FOR HIS RETURN. HE COMPARES THE COMING OF THE SON OF JAN TO THE DAYS OF NOAH. BEFORE THE FLOOD, PEOPLE LIVED THEIR ORDINARY LIVES—EATING, DRINKING, MARRYING—COMPLETELY UNAWARE OF THE JUDGMENT THAT WAS ABOUT TO COME. THEY DID NOT RECOGNIZE THE SIGNS UNTIL IT WAS TOO LATE. IN THE SAME WAY, JESUS SAYS HIS RETURN WILL ARRIVE SUDDENLY AND WITHOUT WARNING.

HE ILLUSTRATES THIS WITH TWO BRIEF IMAGES: TWO
MEN WORKING IN A FIELD AND TWO WOMEN GRINDING
IT A MILL—ONE TAKEN AND ONE LEFT. THIS SEPARATION
SHOWS THAT READINESS FOR THE LORD CANNOT BE
BORROWED OR SHARED: EACH PERSON MUST BE
PREPARED INDIVIDUALIY.


JESUS URGES HIS FOLLOWERS TO "STAY AWAKE." NOT IN THE LITERAL SENSE. BUT SPIRITUALLY—LIVING IN A WAY THAT REFLECTS FAITH. OBEDIENCE. AND AWARENESS OF GOD'S PRESENCE. JUST AS A HOMEOWNER WOULD STAY ALERT IF HE KNEW A THIEF WAS COMING. DISCIPLES MUST REMAIN VIGILANT IN THEIR LIVES BECAUSE THE EXACT MOMENT OF CHRIST'S RETURN IS UNKNOWN. HIS MESSAGE IS CLEAR: LIVE EACH DAY READY TO MEET THE LORD, FOR THE SON OF MAN WILL COME AT AN UNEXPECTED HOUR.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

1. WHY DOES JESUS COMPARE HIS RETURN TO THE DAYS OF NOAH?

BECAUSE PEOPLE THEN WERE UNPREPARED AND UNAWARE UNTIL DISASTER CAME. JESUS USES THIS EXAMPLE TO EMPHASIZE THE NEED FOR SPIRITUAL READINESS.

2. What does "Stay Awake" mean in this passage? IT means living with faith. Awareness. And moral readiness—remaining spiritually alert because Christ could return at any moment.
