

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ...



While we just ended the Christmas season and entered Ordinary time, Lent is just around the corner. I wanted to take this week's column to give everyone a heads up about something that we will be doing during Lent. For the Mass parts, the Holy Holy Holy, the memorial acclamation, and the Lamb of God, we will be singing them in Latin for the duration of Lent. In the weeks leading up to Lent I will take a different Mass part each week and before Mass go over that Mass part. We will also have cards in the hymnal racks with the text of the Mass parts so that everyone can participate.

It begs the question though, why? There is the short answer and the long answer. The short answer is because the Church has said that every Catholic should be able to recite and sing the parts of the Mass that are proper to them in their own language and Latin. These parts are: the Gloria, the Creed the Holy holy holy, the memorial acclamation, the Lord's Prayer, and the Lamb of God. Even Pope Francis, who was hardly a fan of the Latin Mass, expressed that Catholics should know these things. So, since the Church says we should know these parts in Latin, I, as the pastor, feel like I should make an effort to make that happen. Obviously, we will not work on the Gloria during Lent because we don't sing the Gloria during Lent. We may eventually learn the Creed and Lord's Prayer, but I prefer to work on something more manageable at first.

The Longer answer is that while the Second Vatican Council, commonly called Vatican II, allowed for the use of local languages in the Mass, it did not change the fact that for centuries Latin was the language of the Mass. Latin is still the official language of the Church. Any official document that comes out from the Church, and you are reading it in English, is a translation. It was originally written in Latin. We should not lose touch with our roots and traditions. I am not a priest who is going to advocate for the Mass in Latin, I have no problems with it, but I think it is not the best expression of our worship because it does not facilitate the participation of the faithful in the liturgy. However, I do believe that we need to not forget our history and that we should make an effort to reconnect to this aspect of our faith. Some in the parish will love this and others will find it to be a hardship. Either way, I think that it is important that we learn this.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

JOHN THE BAPTIST RECOGNIZED JESUS AND PUBLICLY PROCLAIMED WHO HE TRULY WAS. WHEN JESUS APPROACHED, JOHN CALLED HIM "THE LAMB OF GOD". REVEALING THAT JESUS CAME TO TAKE AWAY THE SINS OF THE WORLD. ALTHOUGH JOHN HAD NOT FULLY KNOWN JESUS BEFORE, GOD REVEALED HIS IDENTITY THROUGH A SIGN: THE HOLY SPIRIT DESCENDING LIKE A DOVE AND REMAINING UPON HIM.

JOHN EXPLAINED THAT HIS MISSION OF BAPTIZING WITH WATER WAS MEANT TO PREPARE THE WAY AND MAKE JESUS KNOWN TO ISRAEL. SEEING THE SPIRIT REST UPON JESUS CONFIRMED WHAT GOD HAD TOLD HIM—THAT JESUS IS THE ONE WHO WOULD BAPTIZE WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT. THROUGH THIS EXPERIENCE, JOHN CONFIDENTLY TESTIFIED THAT JESUS IS THE SON OF GOD.
